We later learned that those hunters found the deer they hit and that they had returned to their homes in Ohio that evening-the reason for their haste. Of course you know we don't begrudge them the deer they got as the out-of-state hunting license is plenty high-but it does seems that they could have agreed on a prearranged signal that would have brought the others of their party out of the woods without blasting the whole country-side.

TECHNIQUE OF Using Bait For Deer

The bowhunter has selected a method of hunting that gives a great deal of the advantage to the hunted. The animals that you are seeking are in their own evironment. Their senses are developed to a higher degree than ours. They are superior in hearing, seeing and smelling and thinking.

Our one advantage is our ability to reason. Now we know deer travel to a definite pattern. Sleeping or bedding grounds-Feeder or approach trails - Feeding areas - Escape trails, etc. The pattern is there but due to the number of trails to choose from that the deer are traveling, we can spend many unproductive hours waiting for the deer to pass our selected ambush. With a limited amount of time available to the hunter it is obvious that we must devise a method to force the deer into a predictable pattern, and the simplest is that of using bait.

Bait for deer can be apples, potatoes, greens of any kind, rutabaga, squash, turnip, etc. I have tried them all and apples are the most practical SALT CANNOT BE USED since it is illegal. Four of the six deer taken in our camp this year were taken over apples.

Place the apples, approximately two dozen, exactly where you wish to have the deer at the time of your shot. It will take three days for the deer to hit the apples regularly. You can check and replace your bait each morning around 9:00 or 10:00 A.M. One big advantage that the use of bait will furnish you, is that it will enable you to bring the deer in, earlier in the day, thus, giving you more productive hunting hours and better light to shoot in. The deer, knowing of the apples and their limited supply, hasten to be the first to devour the new found food. Their greed can thus lead to their downfall since they sacrifice the security that darkness usually gives to their movements. Build a wide "V" shaped obstacle beyond the apples that will force the deer into a broadside shot instead of head on. Be sure to smash six or eight of the apples with a broken branch each day, to let the odor escape and this will help the deer to detect the bait much more quickly. It is important to keep your scent away from the apples and area as much as possible, so, do not handle the fruit without gloves, and approach the bait from a direction that deer will not travel.

It is possible for the bowhunter to choose the most ideal location possible for this ambush, since the deer now come to the bait. Old abandoned shacks or farm building are perfect, since they are comfortable and dry. Depressions are also excellent since they hold a hunters odor close to the ground. The distance to the bait is determined by your ability as a hunter and your skill as an archer. Remember, the closer to the bait, the more perfect you must be in your camouflage and actions. Of course, if you get close, it is easier to place your arrow on a vital spot. So, pick your yardage carefully and GOOD HUNTING.

LAKE MICHIGAN DROWNINGS

LANSING—Conservation Director Ralph A. MacMullan issued this statement following the weekend storm which claimed the lives of at least seven coho salmon fisherman in northern Lake Michigan near Frankfort: "This tragic event has injected a grim and somber note into the otherwise bright and happy story of coho salmon introduction into the Great Lakes. My personal sympathies go out to the families and friends of the victims of the storm."

"Frankly, we were afraid something like this would happen, despite the efforts of the Coast Guard, the Conservation Department, local law enforcement agencies, marina operators, and others to enforce safety standards in the coho fishing areas."

"Our Boat and Water Safety Section has issued repeated warnings that any boat under 18 feet in length is generally unsafe for any but very limited use in the Great Lakes, where sudden and vicious storms frequently develop with little warning.

"Most small, light boats used on Michigan inland lakes simply are not suited to the Great Lakes, yet we have observed during the past several weeks everything from canoes to rubber dinghies many miles off shore in Lake Michigan."

"Considering the severity of that Saturday's storm and the large number of boats caught out in it, the death toll apparently will be miraculously low. Even one death, however, is too many. No fish is worth risking one's life."

"I urge coho fisherman to equip themselves wih adequate boats next year before venturing offshore, or hire the services of those who have them. Besides the 18-foot length minimum, such boats should have high freeboard, maximum stability, and all Coast Guard prescribed safety equipment. An auxiliary motor is an excellent idea."

"In addition, fisherman should heed posted small craft warnings and carry transistor radios to monitor local weather forecasts. Above all, they should head for shelter at the first hint of foul weather."
