M.B.H. Pheasant Hunt Successful

In spite of a four inch snow on Saturday, it turned out a beautiful day for the Bownhunters Pheasant Hunt at the Fairweather Preserve out of Fenton on Sunday, December 11th. The fresh snow made tracking easy and although the air was crisp it was a beautiful day to be out hunting. Thirty-two hunters participated in the event but it was felt the number was held down somewhat by the hazardous driving warnings that came in on the weather broadcasts all day Saturday and Sunday.


The hunt began at noon but hunters drifting in earlier enjoyed Mrs. Fairweathers hot coffee, chili and sandwiches.

The group of hunters was divided into two groups and birds were released so all had shootings. Contrary to previous occassions no birds were taken at this stage of the hunt. The birds scattered over the preserve and principally into heavy cover. The bowhunters broke up into small groups and happy shouts could be heard around the preserve when hunters got a bird. More often than not hunters missed clean with a shot at a bird and their shouts were calling attention to other hunters that a bird was entering their area.

As is usual in hunting, amusing events always occur. John Jones made a successful hit on a nice rooster but the falling bird landed in a big oak tree twenty-five feet up. The writers son, Bruce, came to the

rescue at this point, climbed the tree and dislodged the bird which John kindly gave to him.

Later in the afternoon hunters began to drift back to the farm house for more of Mrs. Fairweathers hot coffee and chili and to discuss the afternoon hunt and tabulate the birds taken. A summary of the afternoon revealed that sixteen birds were released and sixteen birds taken. We had no way of knowing if these birds were the same released earlier in the day as more birds are released each month than are taken by hunters. Hunting Preserves operate under strict rules set up by the Conservation Department. Each bird taken is tagged with a metal seal on the lea and the preserve must keep accurate accounts of the birds taken, hunters name and license number. These records are turned into the

Department periodically.

Highlights of MBH Board Meeting

Probably the most important item taken care of at the meeting, held at Loren Willeys on December 4th was the decision to print our own monthly edition of Michigan Bow Hunters News beginning with the January issue. It was the concensus of opinion that since we had no control of "Archery in Michigan publication dates". It would be better to print our own monthly edition which would afford up to date coverage news. Since this will be a four page pamphlet with an occassional extra insert sheet when needed it was decided to send it by first class mail of district events and bowhunting to assure better and quicker postal delivery. In the past we have mailed

by third class mail but this has been very very slow, especially in some areas. Even though first class mailing would add up to quite an added expense each year, it was deemed a worthwhile expenditure at least for the present time.

Enclosed with this issue you will find a 1967 MBH Membership Contest blank, listing the rules and prizes that can be won by members who participate. This contest has been held for several years now, to help increase our membership list and also to get memberships in early in the year ahead of the usual August and September deluge. ON LEGISLATION, MBH will again try for an extended bow season for its members and you will be kept posted as soon as we have definite news to report. The Legislature will return to session in January after the holiday season. Vice-President Douglas Bartrem heads the legislative committee and he has high hopes of getting some results during the coming year.

The MBH Annual Deer Silhouette Shoot will again be hosted by the Tuscola County Archers at Caro on September 23 & 24, 1967. Mark these dates on your calender and watch for news later in the year.

Members in the uneven districts will receive nominating ballots for Governors in January. The two nominees from each district receiving the most votes will be placed on the election ballot in each respective district if the nominee accepts the nomination. These positions in the Organization are very important and requires a person with ideas and time to promote the organization in his district. The President and Vice President are also elected in the uneven numbered years and serve a two year term the same as the Governors.

IT'S TIME TO TAKE A STAND

The indiscriminate use of the bow and arrow has too long been a thorn in organized archery's side and with archery's rapid growth. We are sure to be faced with more and more of these things. There is no way we can possibly control the use of the Bow and Arrow outside of our own organizations but the adverse publicity our sport gets from these misdeeds committed by persons using the tools of our sport, tells us it is time we take a stand.

The recent slaying of tame deer at a Macomb County Amusement Park has prompted action from organized archery throughout the State of Michigan. A reward fund totalling \$500.00 to date has been offered by Archery Clubs, Michigan Bow Hunters and Michigan Archers Associations for information leading to the capture and conviction of person or persons guilty of this act.

The seriousness of this offense and its detriment to the sport of harchery has prompted a united front from all archery organizations in the state. The outcome being a "MICHIGAN ARCHERS AND BOWHUNTERS FUND". The purpose of the fund will be to help police the use of the bow and arrow by offering rewards for information leading to the conviction of anyone using the bow and arrow to commit needless crimes, as in the slaying of the tame deer in the Macomb County Amusement Park.

Once it becomes public knowledge that there will be standing rewards for such offenses, we think the would be offenders will think twice before committing these acts. The fund will be managed jointly by representatives from the Michigan Bow Hunters and the Michigan Archers Association. Let's get behind this fund and protect our sport.
